# PARAÍBA

### LOCATION: IN THE HEART OF THE NORTHEAST

- Borders with the states of Rio Grande do Norte, Pernambuco and Ceará.
- Port of Cabedelo, the easternmost in the Atlantic Ocean.
- Ponta do Seixas, the most easterly point in the Americas, is located here.

Being at the right time and in the right place is fundamental. And here in Paraíba, you can do it. In addition to this Brazilian state being the easternmost of the Americas, thus being closer to Europe and Africa, Paraíba is bordered by two of the largest northeastern markets, easily accessible by land and air. So, within our borders, you can position yourself in an economically and geographically strategic location.

At the same time, the state's economy is also one of the most prosperous in Brazil. Paraíba has, in the last years, the highest growth of the Northeast region and the 6th in the whole country. Reports reveal the strength of an increasingly strong consumer scenario and that it's ready to grow in the short and medium term.



Even in the face of an unfavorable scenario, Paraíba remains with outstanding potential for consumption. In the two largest cities in Paraíba, João Pessoa (capital) and Campina Grande, the consumption potential in 2020 was R\$ 24.371 billion, representing 40% of the state's total consumption (R\$ 60.761 billion). The

two cities are connected by a 120 km double-lane federal highway in good conditions.

On top of that, counting João Pessoa and its two neighboring capitals, Recife (PE) and Natal (RN), the potential in 2019 reached R\$ 70 billion. The three cities are within a 287 km radius, also connected by a double-lane federal highway with good traffic conditions, the BR-101.





João Pessoa obtained in 2020 the second-lowest CVLI Rate of the century. In 2019 it had the second-lowest rate among the capitals of the Northeast. Currently, it has a 64% accumulated dip.






# > TOURISM

### → CABO BRANCO TOURIST SECTOR

Located between the warm waters of our southern coast and the green of the Atlantic Forest, the largest tourist complex in the Northeast is being born. Completely planned, the complex already houses a convention center and the Parque das Trilhas, the largest environmental reserve of native Atlantic Forest inserted in the urban areas of Brazil. A unique structure that is already receiving a lot of attention inside and outside the country. There are already four projects with signed contracts that will bring resorts, a water park, and a spa hotel, taking the sector to a new level.



# > TOURISM

#### **SURF WORLD PARK**

A Spanish development, with superior luxury standards and five stars, will consist of a water park and a resort, housing the largest artificial wave pool in Brazil and one of the largest in the world - with 31 thousand m<sup>2</sup> and 200 m in diameter, besides several other water attractions.

Surf World Park aims to be a world touristic reference, which will combine leisure and surfing with an environment with quality of life, promoting sustainable recreational tourism, fully integrated with the environment. Installed in an area of 240 thousand m², the project will also have an amphitheater, squares, gastronomic area and bars, a center for the elderly, kindergarten, open-air disco, medical post, gym and spa, surf school, gourmet market, skate park, artificial wave pool, and sand beach.

### OCEAN PALACE JAMPA ECO BEACH RESORT

Also designed as a high-end development, superior luxury category, five stars, and international level, the Ocean Palace Jampa Eco Beach Resort will have 400 more apartments and also stands out for being a sustainable project. Energetically self-sufficient and integrated with nature, its facilities will be powered by renewable energy.

The Ocean Palace Jampa Eco Beach Resort will occupy more than 43 thousand m² area and will submit the most varied leisure activities, including nature trails, sports courts, water slides, yoga and pilates rooms, gym, a venue for events, cinema, lobby, lounges, cyber café, beauty salon, spa and several options of regional and international cuisine, as well as accommodation in an all-inclusive system.

#### **AMADO BIO & SPA HOTEL**

To reframe standards and behaviors, Amado Bio & Spa Hotel will use concepts such as biophilic design (way to create natural environments), tailor-made, wellness and mindfulness, personalizing services for each guest, both concerning the environment and spaces and equipment.

The Amado Bio & SPA Hotel will be built in an area of almost 40 thousand m<sup>2</sup> and its structure will have a capacity of 240 units, 82 of which will be built in the first six months and the others in up to one year. All of this blended with the ocean, cliffs, and forests where the Tourist Sector is located.







### **CONVENTION CENTER**

Located in João Pessoa, this structure is one of the country's most modern and has four large structures: the Tower do Mirante, the Pavilion of Fairs and Expositions, the Pavilion of Congresses and Conventions, and the Pedra do Reino Theater. Its structure allows hosting events such as fairs, exhibitions, symposia, congresses, as well as great shows, such as plays and concerts.



The energy potential, mainly wind and solar, and the incentive policies, make Paraíba a great opportunity for investment in electricity generation projects. The state has tax incentives adequate infrastructure in roads and telecommunications, transmission lines for the flow of generated energy, agility in environmental licensing, and policies for the promotion and incentive of renewable energies. In addition, it maintains policies to support enterprises and promotes the communication of investors with state and municipal entities.



Paraíba has one of the highest solar exposure rates in Brazil, according to the Brazilian Atlas of Solar Energy.




In January 2021, the installed distributed generation power in the state reached around 89.2 MW, benefiting 6,337 consumer units.

### **LEGISLATION AND INCENTIVE POLICIES**

Exemption from ICMS taxes for equipment and materials used in the generation of solar and wind energy, such as solar water heaters, wind turbines, solar cells in modules or panels, wind energy generator support tower, and motor shovel or wind turbine.

Reduction of ICMS for solar and wind power generation companies, through the granting of presumed credit applied to the outstanding balance of investments in electrical equipment, such as power transformers, among others.



Paraíba has excellent geographical conditions for the production of wind energy. In addition to the favorable wind conditions, there are vast areas with adequate terrain for the implementation of wind farms. The economic activities of these places can coexist along with the development of the production of this type of energy.



Through the Executive Secretariat for Science and Technology, the Government of Paraíba supports the international research project for the construction of a radio telescope in the state's countryside. The "Baryon Acoustic Oscillations in Neutral Gas Observations" (BINGO) is a "big science" project that brings technological development, scientific knowledge to our inland cities and promotes scientific research exchange.

Already in the planning stage, START CORE-PB (Paraíba Applications Center) will help our state students develop apps, in an incubator model. The purpose of the nucleus is to give autonomy and visibility to good technological and educational practices applied in learning spaces and our state, promoting tactics that develop academic and technological advancement.

This air terminal will have the potential to operate with approximately **100 thousand passengers/year** and will promote greater integration with the Paraíba countryside, stimulating all the productive chains in the region.



The largest water project in the state, with an extension of **130.44 km**, 60% of which is already completed, will benefit **630 thousand** people, supporting farming production on 16 thousand hectares in **38 municipalities**.



#### **DAM RECOVERY PROGRAM**

Through the Dam Recovery Program, **150 dams** are receiving work from the state government, through Seirhma and the Water Management Executive Agency (Aesa). Around R\$ **30 million** were invested, with state resources, and it's expected to be concluded in April 2021.



Besides being one of the beneficiaries with the transposition of waters of the São Francisco River, the state, through the Paraíba State Water Security Project (PSH/PB), will develop one of the largest programs in the sector, aiming at expanding service to the population.

The Transparaíba Adductor System, an operation that counts with **US\$ 126,886,000** financed by the World Bank, will improve the availability of water resources in **27 cidades**, in the regions of Borborema and Agreste, as well as improve the operational efficiency of water and sewage services in the Metropolitan Region of João Pessoa.




#### **ELECTRICITY**

Currently, there are **36 electric power generating plants** in operation in Paraíba, with a total installed capacity of **888.26 MW**. The transmission system covers the entire state, meeting energy demands in all regions.

Managed by Companhia Docas da Paraíba, the Port of Cabedelo is a strategic point for national and international cargo handling. With a privileged location, integrated with the road network and low costs, it's an excellent choice for maritime logistics.



Since 2017, all Paraíba cities are interconnected by paved highways and properly signposted. Indicators place Paraíba as one of the Brazilian states with the best road infrastructures, both in extension and in technical-operational quality.



MINERAL POTENTIAL

Paraíba's soil has an immense mineral potential. According to the National Mining Agency, there are great chances of discovering new veins in the state. At the same time, the Government of Paraíba offers incentives to promote the sector, which is one of the most successful in the country.

Paraíba is also a welcoming state when it comes to receiving new companies and investments. State and municipalities work together to bring incentives and thus generate good business, both for those who arrive and for those who are already here.



PARAÍBA STATE TAX **INCENTIVES** 

**FAIN - Paraíba Industrial Development Support Fund** 

> For the implantation, expansion, revitalization, and relocation of industries considered to be of relevant interest to the state, with presumed ICMS credit of up to 74.25%.

**Location Incentive** 

Concession of areas at subsidized prices, depending on the choice of the municipality and the availability of land in the region where the company will be installed.

- **Exemption from ICMS taxes** for the purchase of machinery and equipment for the generation of renewable energy (wind and solar).
- Paraíba State Development Program -**PRODES -** Law no 10,974/2017 (presumed credit of up to 99%).
- **Decree 40,211/2020** Reduction of the tax burden to 4% and 1% in domestic and interstate operations, for wholesale trade.
- **Decree 40,697/2020** Textile Sector 3rd Fiscal Region - Benefit that guarantees the reduction of the tax burden of the clothing industry to 2% and a reduction of the tax burden to 3%, in the sales operations of small clothing retailers companies, with standard payment regime, referring to

products manufactured in Paraíba.
